She then received her medical degree from the University of South Florida Morsani College of Medicine in Tampa, FL where she received the N. Donald Diebel, Jr. M.D., Memorial Scholarship Award.

From there, Dr. Ladd went on to complete her anatomic and clinical pathology residency at the University of Colorado School of Medicine in Aurora, CO. During residency, she honed her teaching skills with experience instructing first and second year medical students on a variety of organ systems and was recognized with a Medical Student Small Group Teaching Award in 2018. As part of a departmental global health initiative, she travelled to Cusco, Peru with colleagues and served as a cytology volunteer at CerviCusco Women's Health Clinic, a non-profit medical clinic committed to providing accessible health care to women. Back in Colorado, she worked with colleagues in the development of the maximum surgical blood ordering schedule (MSBOS) for the University of Colorado Hospital. Dr. Ladd also earned the highest PGY-1 score among her peers for the Pathology Resident In-Service Exam (RISE).

After her residency, Dr. Ladd completed a surgical pathology fellowship at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri.

There she continued teaching in resident unknown case conferences and participated in the validation of a Faxitron digital x-ray cabinet.
