Dr. Rozelle joined Incyte Diagnostics in June, 2016. He is board certified in anatomic and clinical pathology and dermatopathology.

Dr. Rozelle completed his undergraduate degree in Biology at Whitman College in Walla Walla where he was a scholar athlete and NCAA Academic All-American. He was awarded the Whitman College J. Stanley Brode Memorial Biological Life Sciences Award.

He then received his medical degree from Saint Louis University School of Medicine. Dr. Rozelle completed his residency at the Oregon Health Sciences University in Portland and served as chief resident. He was also honored with the Chief Resident Award in Anatomic and Clinical Pathology.

Following graduation from residency, Dr. Rozelle completed a two-year tour at Dwight D. Eisenhower Army Medical Center in Fort Gordon, GA. While there, he was responsible for general surgical pathology and cytopathology services and was medical director for the clinical laboratory. He provided surgical resident research support and presented multiple tumor boards. Dr. Rozelle received numerous honors including the Army Achievement Award and the Eisenhower Army Medical Center Commander's Coin for Excellence. He was also named to the dean's list for MEDCOM Officer Leadership Course.

After his time at Eisenhower Medical Center, Dr. Rozelle began a fellowship in dermatopathology at the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda, MD. His fellowship integrated clinical dermatology and dermatopathology training with the Joint Pathology Center

(formerly AFIP) and the National Institutes of Health. During his training, he made presentations at the American Society of Dermatopathology as well as the International Society of Dermatopathology.

After completing his fellowship, Dr. Rozelle served as a pathologist/dermatopathologist and medical director of transfusion services at Madigan Army Medical Center, Joint Base Lewis-McChord, WA. In addition to these responsibilities, he received consultations from all over the region as the regional Department of Defense dermatopathology consultant. He was additionally awarded the Meritorious Service Medical, an Army commendation medal and the Joint Service Achievement Medal. In 2016, he honorably separated from the US Army Medical Corps at the rank of Major.
